Explorations

Exploration 1

Who said you could only blow soap bubbles in the summer?!

The Earth rotates, causing more direct sunrays in summer. This also causes less direct sunrays in winter, leading to colder temperatures. What would happen if you tried blowing soap bubbles on a winter day?

Task: Get outside and blow some bubbles! See if you can video what happens to the bubble when it's cold out (-9°c or colder). Click here for ideas. Ask yourself these questions and draw your observations in a journal:

What do I see? What do I Know? What do I Wonder?

Exploration 2

We are surrounded with forces everywhere we go and in everything we do. To learn more about the push and pull force, click the photo below.





Task: In groups, create the largest snowball you can by using the push and/or pull force. When you can no longer move it, transform your large snowball into a 3D object and measure the distance around and the height. Try not to have the same 3D objects as other groups in your class.

Whose 3D object will be the



largest? tallest?

Exploration 3

Close your eyes and imagine.....Trekking through the 6 feet of snow hunting and searching for food. Every step you sink deeper and deeper into the snow. How would you feel? How would vou continue?

Task: Explore First Nations Innovations and create your own snowshoes using items from around your school (inside and out). Now, take them outside and try them. Did they work? What happened? What would you need to change to make them better?
